The Rev. Dr. Philip Conrad Linder Called to be Rector of St. John's

On Sunday, July 3, Ned Meekins, Co-Convenor of the Nominating Committee, and Karen Koontz, Senior Warden, officially announced that The Rev. Dr. Philip C. Linder has been called to be Rector of St. John's.

Ordained to the priesthood in 1985, Philip has served as Associate Rector and Priest in Charge of St. Martin in the Fields, Atlanta, GA, Rector of Holy Trinity, Decatur, GA for 9



years, and most recently as the Dean of Trinity Cathedral in Columbia, SC for 11 years. Philip has a Doctorate in Psychology from the Graduate Theological Foundation, Oxford, England and Indiana, a Doc-

torate in Ministry from Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA; a Masters in Divinity from The General Theological Seminary, NY; and, a Bachelor of Science in Education from Villanova University, PA. He has taught as an Adjunct Professor of Re-



ligion at the University of South Carolina.

Philip has served as a Deputy to three General Conventions, serving as Deputation chair for Upper South Carolina in 2006 and 2009. He is strongly committed to the Millennium Development Goals, local outreach, and an inclusive Church. He has served on the boards of Community Food Banks, the Salvation Army, and Kanuga. Seven years ago Philip and his wife Ellen began the Columbia week at Camp Bob, Kanuga, a summer camp experience for 90 under-

served inner-city children. Philip has been married for twenty-nine years; his wife, Ellen, is an RN and they have three grown children: Gabrielle 28, Conrad 25, and



Philip Jr. 22. He is an artist with a passion for pastoral care, writing, teaching, horses, and seeking to serve Christ and the people of God. In 2004 he published *A Priest's Journal of Hope*.

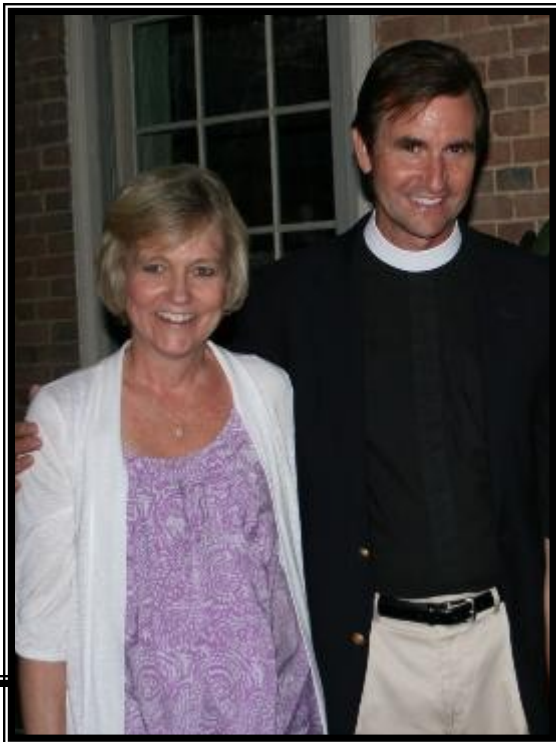

The View from the Bench by Stephen Leist

In the later part of June, I attended the annual conference of the Association of Anglican Musicians, held this year in Greenville, South Carolina, where I grew up. Attending this conference is not only refreshing artistically, but spiritually, as the services feature a variety of liturgical practices. The opening and closing Eucharist was held at Christ Church, which is where I spent the first 20 years of my choir life. When I arrived for the opening service, it was a joy to meet up with friends I had not seen in many years. I also had the opportunity to spend a fair amount of time with Robert Powell and his wife Nancy, who, in addition to being close friends, have also been great mentors. The many activities included a service of all shape-note music at Church of the Advent in Spartanburg, sung Morning Prayer at St. James' in Hendersonville NC, lunch and tour of the Biltmore House, and Choral Evensong at All Soul's in Asheville, sung by the choir of Trinity Cathedral in Columbia SC, led by Jared Johnson. One of the conference speakers was David Hill, formerly choirmaster at Winchester Cathedral and now director of the London Bach Choir (succeeding Sir David Willcocks) and the BBC Choir. I was pleased to learn new ideas on rehearsal technique as well as to be reinforced on the things I already do here at St. John's—proof that I am not crazy. The AAM is also so folksy that even if you did not know anyone, you would find new friends quickly, and it was great to make some new acquaintances.

As we begin to return from vacations and a time of recess, it is time to begin digesting all of this and

start gearing up for the fall. I am looking forward to implementing some of the ideas I picked up as well as presenting some of the commissioned music to the choir. Professional memberships are expensive, and for my work here I maintain three: the American Guild of Organists, the Association of Anglican Musicians, and the Organ Historical Society. It is events like this one just attended where they pay off, because the information gained is priceless. Next year's conference will be in Philadelphia, and it already promises to be very exciting.

Dear Karen,

I have received a call from The Episcopal Church of the Holy Comforter in Montgomery, Alabama, to serve as interim rector. You anticipate the arrival of The Rev. Dr. Philip Linder as your new rector in approximately two months. Therefore, I tender my resignation as rector in the interim effective, Saturday, July 30, 2011. Vacation and off days mean that today is my last Sunday and the Wednesday healing service will be my final liturgy with you.

I am thankful for the call your vestry extended to me sixteen months ago and for the ministry we have shared in these intervening months. This has been a long and taxing journey for you all with many anxious moments. Losing a beloved rector, adjusting to a new personality, undergoing the transitions that changes demand, and facing the uncertainties of the search process have been challenging.

But, you have responded lovingly and faithfully to those challenges. You have endeared yourselves to me. The St. John's story and my personal story and your personal stories have become inseparably intertwined. Each Sunday we have joined those stories with the great story of God's saving love in Christ, and we have experienced God's transforming love interweaving us with one another and with God.

Please know that you will always be present with me, and you will be in my prayers each week so long as God gives me breath.
